**May 14th Meeting:** The elections were held and the newly elected officers will officially take over council business July 1, 2007. There will be a ceremonial handing off of duties during the June meeting at the conclusion of Old Business. The By-Laws were approved as amended and hopefully are approved quickly by the Supreme, so as to get a copy of the Council's By-Laws in each member's hands. The Council By-Laws have not been officially approved by the Supreme Advocate since 1970. There were also expenses approved for a \$50.00 donation for Council to sponsor a hole for the St. Timothy's Golf Outing and \$100.00 to the Memorial Day Parade Committee to provide a lunch following the parade for the participants.

**Membership:** As of this writing the council's goal set by the Supreme of a net (11) new members this fiscal year is at (10). If you are aware of someone that is interested in becoming a Knight or possibly rejoining the Order let me or one of the council officers know. We may be able to locate a nearby 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Exemplification during the last few weeks.

**Miles Christi Retreat:** Bill Temple and I made the retreat with the Miles (pronounced me-less) Christi, Latin for Soldiers of Christ, order of priests at the end of April. It was a spiritually rewarding weekend for us both, and I personally am able to say it was long over due. The only thing I regret is that there were not a few more council members present. I hope the Council is able to set one up again next year, and more members consider making the retreat. As Rev. Fr. Patrick Wainwright said, "We get busy in the world and tend to forget about the end goal of Saving our Souls."

**MI Drive Results:** The council collected \$2,053 on Palm Sunday and sent the proceeds to six organizations that provide services for the citizens with mental impairment. The recipients were: Angel's Place, ARC Downriver, Archdiocese of Detroit Special Needs, City of Trenton Special Needs, St. Louis Center, and St. Timothy's Special Needs. Again the council thanks all the workers that participated in the drive. Special thanks to Herb and Carole Tarnowski and Ralph Grabowski for taking time out on Sunday afternoon to count the collections.

**Fourth Degree Exemplification:** There will be another opportunity, this year, to join the Patriotic Degree of the Order. It is scheduled for September 15, 2007 at the De Carlos Banquet Center in Warren. The Master of Michigan District #1, S.K Walter Winkle, has planned this exemplification with the idea of keeping it small to keep the costs down. This would be a good time to take the step. Details will be coming as to time and final costs. You will still need a tuxedo for the day. J.C. Penny's periodically runs a sale for about \$100.00.

PLEASE, please follow the directions at the bottom of the chain. The families very much appreciate our prayers and consideration for their deceased loved one with our attendance. Remember it is one of the Spiritual Works of Mercy we Catholics are to observe, "Pray for the Dead". The following item shows how important this work is, and how much it means to the families.

Joyce Morris, wife of **Troy Morris**, sent a note of appreciation for the Knights coming to pray the Rosary for Troy. She was very moved by the Fourth Degree's "Presentation of the Chalice" made to the family. To quote "Troy would have been so proud, the service was beautiful." Joyce included a donation to the council in memory of Troy. Please keep Joyce and our departed brother Troy in your prayers.

**Council First Degree Team:** We have (5) men interested in being a part of a council degree team. **Know Your Faith:** The Knights of Columbus offer a series of books that will help you to better know your faith. Nominations for these two positions will commence at the July business meeting. The responsibilities of the members on the board are to care for and maintain the facility, our hall. In all there are (9) members on the Building Association, (3) members are the Council Trustees and the other (6) from the membership.

Info for the newsletter is expected by the 18<sup>th</sup> of the month, and I generally give myself a week to pull it all together. This can be done in less than eight hours, unless you start getting creative. Then it could be 20 hours, counting research time. Once the master pages are done, the Editor's job is finished. He is not responsible for printing and distribution.

The tools I use are a PC with Microsoft Word and Internet communications for receiving input from regular contributors, a printer, a dictionary, and the trusty scissors and glue stick to do the things I don't know how to do on the computer (and don't want to bother to learn).
