**4<sup>th</sup> OF JULY PARADE:** St. Stan's council is trying to get as many Knights and their families as possible to march this year. #### **2008 STATE CONVENTION ON MACKINAW ISLAND GRAND KNIGHT'S REPORT MAY 22, 23, 24, 2008**

THE CONVENTION OPENED WITH MASS CELEBRATED BY CARDINAL MAIDA. THERE WERE A NUMBER OF BISHOPS AND OTHER CLERGY PRESENT AND THE 4<sup>TH</sup> DEGREE COLOR CORPS SET THE FLAG IN PLACE FOR THE DURATION OF THE CONVENTION.

AFTER A SHORT BREAK, THE CONVENTION STARTED AT 8PM. STATE DEPUTY THOMAS WEGENER ACKNOWLEDGED THE CLERGY, THANKED THEM FOR THEIR PARTICIPATION, AND AFTER THEY LEFT FOR THEIR OWN MEETING, OURS BEGAN.

THE VARIOUS STATE AND DIOCESAN DIRECTORS GAVE THEIR REPORTS.

THERE OVER 70,000 KNIGHTS IN THE STATE OF MICHIGAN IN 405 COUNCILS.

AFTER THE TIME AND LOCATION OF THE VARIOUS COMMITTEES WAS DETERMINED, THE FIRST MEETING ENDED AT ABOUT 10PM.

FRIDAY, MAY 23, STARTED WITH MASS AT 7:30AM. NEWLY ORDAINED BISHOP OF THE DIOCESE OF LANSING, BISHOP EARL BOYER, CELEBRATED THE MASS. AFTER A SHORT BREAK, THE MEETING BEGAN AT 9:30 WITH THE PRESENTATION OF COUNCIL AWARDS. OUR COUNCIL WON THE "MICHIGAN ACHIEVEMENT AWARD" AND AN AWARD FOR EXCEEDING OUR QUOTA TO HCCS. THE MEETING ENDED JUST AFTER 11AM, THEN THE "LIVING ROSARY" BEGAN AT 11:30AM, WITH THE MEMBERS OF THE 4<sup>TH</sup> DEGREE COLOR CORPS FORMING A ROSARY IN HONOR OF THE STATE AND COUNCIL OFFICERS WHO PASSED LAST YEAR.

AFTER THE "ROSARY", THE VARIOUS DIOCESES HELD CAUCUSES MEETINGS TO DISCUSS THE CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR STATE WARDEN.

AT 5:30PM, THE STATE DEPUTY'S BANQUET BEGAN AT THE MAIN DINING ROOM AT THE "GRAND". AFTER DINNER, SEVERAL DIGNITARIES GAVE SPEECHES, FINISHING WITH THE STATE DEPUTY'S "STATE OF COLUMBIANISM IN MICHIGAN". DINNER WAS OVER AT 9:30PM. AFTER DINNER, THE FIVE MEN RUNNING FOR THE STATE WARDEN'S JOB HAD HOSPITALITY ROOMS WHERE YOU COULD TALK TO THEM IN A MORE RELAXED SETTING.

SATURDAY, MAY 24, STARTED WITH MASS AT 7:30 AM. AFTER A SHORT BREAK. THE CONVENTION RESUMED AT 9:30AM. ONLY DELEGATES WERE ALLOWED IN SINCE THE FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS WAS TO ELECT A NEW STATE WARDEN. FIVE MEN WERE RUNNING FOR THE JOB, AND IT WOULD TAKE 261 VOTES TO WIN ON THE FIRST BALLOT. THE FIRST BALLOT TOOK 1 HOUR, WITH KEN UNTERBRINK RECEIVING THE MOST VOTES, 233. SINCE HE DID NOT HAVE THE REQUIRED VOTES, A SECOND BALLOT WAS HELD. THE SECOND BALLOT WENT A LITTLE FASTER THAN THE FIRST, ONLY TAKING 45 MINUTES. KEN UNTERBRINK WAS ELECTED WITH 315 VOTES. IN BETWEEN THE COUNTING OF THE BALLOTS, THE RESOLUTIONS WERE DISCUSSED. ONLY TWO RESOLUTIONS WERE PASSED. THE FIRST, AUTHORIZED THE K of C BOWLING ASSOCIATION TO HOLD A TOURNAMENT IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2008-2009. THE SECOND, SUPPORTED STATE DEPUTY THOMAS WEGENER'S BID TO BE A SUPREME DIRECTOR OF THE KNOGHTS OF COLUMBUS. THE CONVENTION ENDED AT 1:30PM.

#### **Advocate/Membership/District Deputy News**

We did not reach the goal we had set as a council of recruiting (20) new men into the Order last year. However, we did have a good year in getting (13) new Knights. I ask each of you to make an effort over the next two months to recruit neighbors, friends and relatives to join us. **Do you have a need of a Form 100?** If the answer is "Yes!" please contact me or the G.K. to acquire one. Our membership goal for 2008-9 will again be (20) new members, if each of you would just reach out to that man in the pew near you at church each week it will be an easy goal to achieve. If you know of someone that would make a good knight and you feel you don't have the right words to influence them. Let the G.K. or me know who it is and we will contact him for you.

At our last meeting as the **Council Advocate**, I mentioned to the membership that it may be time to raise our initiation fee and the yearly dues. These items are a part of the By-Laws of the council and therefore we need to vote on any changes to the dues and fees. Currently the annual dues are \$40.00 and the initiation fee is \$15.00. In our discussions it was recommended that we raise the dues to \$45.00/yr. and have the initiation fee set at \$20.00. There are couple of reasons for the raises. First, the costs associated with the exemplification of new members have increased, the cost of the Second and Third Degree Staff, the luncheon, and the paraphernalia: pins, etc. usually exceed the \$20.00 proposed initiation fee. Our costs for mailings, per capita fees to the Supreme and State Council's have increased over the past couple of years hence the need to increase our annual dues. We will discuss and vote on the proposed changes at our

July 14, 2008 meeting. The initiation fee will take effect immediately and the dues increase in January 2009, if passed.

**The by-law changes to be to be voted on at our next meeting July 14, 2008 will read:**

*Sec. 2. The initiation fee shall be \$20.00 except that for applicants under 26 years of age it shall be \$10.00 and for Priests and religious it shall be nil. One-half of the initiation fee shall accompany the application but it shall be refunded if the applicant is rejected.*

*Sec. 3. Each member shall pay annual dues, the same to be payable quarterly in advance at the first regular meetings in January, April, July and October. The annual dues of members shall be \$45.00, excepting insured members under 26 years of age whose dues shall be one-half of that sum, honorary members shall pay \$10.00 and honorary life members shall pay nothing. Except as above stated, the dues of associate and insurance members shall be the same.*

As your DD, I want to congratulate the men that have been elected to lead your council's. I ask that everyone get behind these gentlemen and offer your prayers and services to make your councils all that Fr. Michael J. McGivney expected of them. Second, there are many areas in the council that your G.K. will need some help. I'm referring to the many appointments/positions that must be filled: Community, Church, Youth, Council, Health, etc. directorships. So, when asked to serve please say, "Yes". Third, I want to **thank all** that helped the District to achieve many of our objectives for the year. We did reach a 100% of our membership goal and as a District we did have a successful HCCS fundraiser. Finally, I request that each of you during this summer season continue to recruit those you see in church and ask these men to join us in our service to God, Our Church, our families and our community.

Some items of interest from the State Convention held on Mackinac Island: the 405 councils of Michigan donated over \$200, 000 to seminarians and religious, a first; more than \$200,000 to Special Olympics, which makes the Michigan Knights a "Gold Sponsor" of the Michigan Special Olympics, another first; and our newly elected State Warden is Kenneth Unterbrink of the Lansing Diocese.

Have a safe and enjoyable summer! Don't forget we still meet once a month even in the summer. WE are having a **1<sup>st</sup> Degree team practice on Sunday July 20<sup>th</sup> at 4 P.M.**, if you are interested in being a part of the staff.

***Governor Ignores Michigan Citizens, Vetoes Partial Birth Abortion Ban***

After passage in the Michigan House and Senate, Governor Jennifer Granholm wasted no time vetoing the Michigan [partial birth abortion](#) ban bill on Friday, June 13. Prior to the bill being enrolled, RLM President Barbara Listing sent a formal letter to the Governor inviting her to discuss the bill. But the Governor declined to meet with RLM. Governor Granholm was the only obstacle standing in the way of Michigan citizens finally getting their long sought-after ban on the [late term abortion procedure](#).

**Michigan's Abortions Decrease in 2007 to the Lowest Number on Record**

According to statistics released May 22, 2008, from the Michigan Department of Community Health, the **number of abortions performed in Michigan decreased in 2007**. The report from the Michigan Department of Community Health states that 24,683 abortions were performed in Michigan during 2007 compared to 25,636 Michigan abortions in 2006, **a drop of 3.7 percent** or **953 abortions**. Since 1987, there has been a **49.7 percent decrease** in the number of abortions performed in Michigan annually. Abortions in Michigan have decreased three of the last four years and the total from 2007 represents the lowest number of reported abortions in Michigan since reporting began in 1979.
